Meeting News

Promptly at 7:30 AM, Lorraine, banged the gavel, welcomed every one and started the meeting. She reminded us that there will be no morning meeting next week.

May 30th will be our Visioning meeting at the Round Barn- It will be a simple dinner, for \$10 followed by a discussion of future long range plans for our club. Gene Scarpato reported on the district Conference in Lincoln, N.H that he attended last week with his wife and Doug and his wife. Jim Leyton drove over just for the day. Doug & Gene took 4 exchange students; the girl from France, the girl from Spain, a boy from Denmark and a boy from Brazil. All four spoke of their experiences living in the US.

Dist. Gov. Marion Bedell spoke of the conference theme – "Inspiring new generations into Rotary". Jack Miner was recognized for his efforts to increase membership in our club including the younger generation.

Friday - 1st day we were treated to the "cafe Lafayette dinner train". It was a good meal but took 2 hours with lots of gaps between courses.

Sat - The GSE team from So. Africa did their presentation about their Rotary Club and culture and products, especially gold. It is one of only 2 countries with safe tap water. It is a middle income country and to date the only country to dismantle its nuclear arsenal. It is multi-cultural - 11 official languages.

Walter Hughes - from Rocky Mt. Va. Rotary Club is making an effort to rid Ghana of worm disease that infects standing water -with a parasite that when consumed by humans causing pain and crippling effects and in many cases death. Since 2005, our district, along with others, have contributed towards this research eliminating the worm disease from Ghana.

PROGRAM

After Jim Groom had connected the computer to show photos on the screen, Lorraine introduced Sean Lawson of "Lawson's Finest Liquids" (Brewery). This brewer master has won silver and bronze medals - unfortunately can't give free samples here because of the liquor license.

Their product "Maple Triple" won at World Beer Cup.

Sean then displayed family photos (wife and 2 daughters). 41 years ago he started as a home brewer.

His first paying job, after college was washing dishes: worked at Mad River Glen.

In 2007 he started business in a shed, size 300 sq. ft - made deliveries with his hybrid - it was a one man show. His brewery was a one barrel system of 30 gallons - he made 30 gallons at a time. Opened in 2008 with 4 products at the Warren Store.

Now he has an updated building, and production includes growing hops. Still all local ingredients - grain - barley fermented into beer. Nothing malted in Vermont.

UVM helped him with the hops industry - needs ground up pellets.

This fall he's putting in new equipment - which extracts sugar, color and transfers to fermenters - process takes several weeks to make beer - then cool for a week. The whole process produces Ale and Lager beer types. Lagers are bottom fermenters - longer process to "cold store" takes 6 weeks.

He makes mostly ale - he doesn't have time to age the beer. He gets help for bottling otherwise it is still a one man show.

His beer is unpasteurized - a live product.

The Maple Triple won out of 4,000 entries (he used maple sap as water.) There were 600 brewers in the competition.

Last year he won 2nd place in National Contest - World Beer Cup

Editor's note: I hope I got all this right, as I am totally ignorant about beer production.
