PROGRAM

Jim Leyton introduced Ken Squier who spent 25 years as a commentator for CBS in conjunction with Vermont Radio Station WDEV. One of his regular features was the Race Car Events at Thunder Road.

He started out by asking all the farmers for a contribution. When he had enough money , he set up a studio in downtown Waterbury and erected the antenna on top of Blush Hill. The farmers were delighted with his news programs as they replaced the party line for learning about local happenings. More people can hear than read.

Both his father and grandfather were dairy farmers. When his grandfather was asked what are your cows doing on the road, he replied "About 4 miles per hour."

In 1926 when he applied for a license for WDEV, he had to explain how his station would benefit the community. Now licenses are awarded to the highest bidder.

Today most of the stations have a music format. WCVT, one of the five stations Ken owns, promotes classical music as Ken has an interest in the Vermont Symphony Orchestra. Radio Vermont has 5 radio stations in Vermont at present.

Ken is famous for reporting race car events. He is connected to every Race Car track in the East. He feels that is what America is all about – noise and danger. He regaled us with several anecdotes about funny and exciting things that occurred to him during his lifetime as a broadcaster

Ken was a very entertaining speaker.
