PROGRAM

Intro for Will Flender by Dinsmore:

It is my pleasure to introduce the new Executive Director for the Mad River Path Association, Will Flender. Will's interest in trail development and management began on Martha's Vineyard, when he was 15. As a teenager, Will spent summers clearing and exploring trails, attending meetings, advocating for trails, fundraising for local conservation organizations, leading guided walks and writing about trails in his book, Walking Trails of Martha's Vineyard, now in its fourth edition. Will received his Bachelor's degree from the University of Maine, and his JD from Vermont Law School. Here in Vermont, Will has remained involved in trails issues

through his volunteer work with Local Motion, and the VT Bicycle and Pedestrian Coalition. Will has been on staff with the Vermont Land Trust, and has worked with the law firm of Sitzel, Page and Fletcher, where he was involved in a variety of real estate matters. Will lives in Burlington with his wife and a baby daughter. Happily for the Mad River Path Association, Will has long had the goal of working professionally for a trails organization.

Will started by thanking us for all of our support and friendship.

The non-profit Path Association began in 1988 as part of the Planning District vision of having a continuous walking path from Moretown to Warren Village. After 22 years it has grown to 456 members. The Path goes thru 3 villages, past town halls and may go past your door and is used daily, presenting different scenic views of our valley.

It is a tremendous asset for the Valley- something people come to see – a great resource. It has 6 sections - but not all connected yet.

They put on a big membership drive each year, as the members provide a high part of their operating revenue; having lots of people makes obtaining grants easier.

Last year a lot of the trail work and bridges were damaged by "Irene". The Millbrook section has been repaired and serves as a way station at races. Path members perform maintenance work on the trails daily.

Projects for this year: September Mad Dash, LOGO design contest, (with \$50 prize for winning LOGO), Mapping - Free maps available and fancy \$5 map produced by Map Adventures is on sale.

With Master Planning, an effort is being made to make our vision a reality.

Phase 3 - Identify routes for path -not all landowners comfortable with strangers crossing their property. 85% of the property owners are involved and negotiations with the rest are in progress. Part of the problem is to get the dog owners to keep their dogs on a leash and pick up their dog poop. (containers are provided along the paths)

Final Phase - all paths will be connected.
