Program

Al Barillaro introduced Win Smith and thanked Win for all he has done for Rotary over the years.

Win congratulated the scholarship winners and offered them a free ski pass.

He feels that Adam has done a great job in Montpelier and that he understands the issues. Adam has a good reputation as an independent, he understands business.

Then he talked about his ski business. He said that last season there were 23 less ski days than the previous year, they closed on their scheduled date, and there was 100" less snow.

Despite those facts, there were more paid skiers and they sold a record number of season passes. With current lift ticket prices, if you ski more than 12 days, it pays to buy a season pass. He thought that since interest rates were so low, people invested in ski passes. They sold over 9,000. Presidents week was up 6%. He was so pleased that the resort had gained customers in a tough financial year.

They are also running the business more efficiently which reduced costs. His staff did an outstanding job.

Since he has the golf course in the Summer time, he is able to offer some of his staff year round employment.

He gives the kids, 17 and under, free golf.

In addition to tennis and golf, he runs 6 Adventure camps, 9 weekly camps (kids 10 - 20); Culinary Activities which support local farmers. They have a float in the 4th of July parade, followed by a BBQ at the Gatehouse Lodge. They also support the Festival of the Arts.

Thus, the Ski Resort now has year round activities and is involved with all of the Valley Events. They give prizes for our fundraising raffles and furnish us with a place to hold our weekly meetings.
