## PROGRAM

The Festival started 12 years ago with the mission of bringing people to the valley and showcase artists for a week-long event. It gradually expanded, filling the restaurants, displaying art for 7 weeks. Then it grew large enough to hire a coordinator. Unfortunately the huge music event failed, people lost money and the Festival was on the verge of bankruptcy.

James Plumpton and the Cricket Club saved them, bought the names and revived the Festival. It grew again and this time they hired a local person to be the coordinator, Beverly Kehoe. It functions with a BOD and the paid coordinator. They are currently looking for a representative from the food industry.

The Festival has grown into a month long event and has an office at the Village Square (around the corner from the gas station). The tourist numbers are growing.

The Red Barn Show started in Warren Town Hall with 12 artists displaying 20 works of art. When it moved to American Flatbread, there were 36 artists, 140 works of art and 26 pieces sold in excess of \$8,000 with 3,000 counted visitors, from 34 states, 3 Canadian Provinces, 17 foreign countries and 45 Vermont towns. Last year there were 10,000 art visits, 100+ events in 31 days and 600 opportunities.

Current plans call for many new events (see schedule for all 31 days) starting with a Preliminary Chamber mixer/gallery dedication July 31st.

Special events: Taste of the Valley, Washington County Field Days, many new events at Sugarbush, Grand Opening of the Warren Library, Craft Fair and Duck Race as the finale.

Visitors may obtain a 'passport' and have it stamped at every event they attend. At the end they will turn in their passport. A prize will be given to both the owner of the passport and the restaurant for the passport with the most stamps. Last year some people kept the passport as a souvenir.

We can help by being ambassadors for the Valley. Personal communication is the best form of advertising. Invite fellow Rotarians to visit, partake of events and sponsor events.
