PROGRAM

Caryn had jury duty today and left John to do the presentation on the remarkable activities of their Mexican Rotary Club (Puerto Vallarta Sur).

John reported that they are very active in the Mexican club. It has 46 members and is located in a resort town which enables them to get donations and matching grants from both tourists and visiting Rotarians from North America.

There are many townspeople and local farmers who are below the poverty level.

This club has been providing them with 4 levels of scholarships since 1996. They gave to 350 students last year from middle school up to college level. These kids know how important education is.

The club has a staff that monitors the grades and makes home visits.

They also give a free meal to families once a week. They offer English classes, run a book mobile, which loans out books. This is a first experience for some adults of borrowing books.

They often give clothing and shoes to the needy. Many children have no shoes. The club has a goal to provide each child with shoes, as shoes are required for a child to attend school.

Eye surgery is needed for crossed eyes and other problems. Many families can't afford surgery. The club provides free surgery. Doctors do the operations for free but each operation cost \$700 - \$1,000 for supplies and other expenses. This is life changing surgery. Prescription glasses are also provided.

Water Filter Program - Clean water is needed and they have built 4 systems both inside and outside of the town. The one on the school grounds also allows individual families to bring buckets to get clean drinking water.

Often kids who have been helped come back to donate services.

Most jobs require knowledge of English and computers. The club gives lessons before and after school for 150 students.

Remember all this fantastic work is done by 46 members with financial help from visiting Rotarians and foreign tourists.

John and/or Caryn will come and finish this talk in the near future.
