Program

Jon Jamieson introduced Dave Mount, who is a past President of the Burlington Rotary Club and the Assistant Governor for five Burlington Area Clubs and led a Group Study Exchange in 2006 to Honduras and Belize.

Dave is also the CEO of the Mount Family Group in Burlington. They own 11 Westaff Temporary Help offices and 2 offices of Remedy Intelligent Staffing MFG offices in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Vermont and New York.

Dave and his wife, Fran have visited Honduras in the Hands to Honduras program since 2008 and they have brought other family members with them.

Honduras is a Spanish speaking country, the second poorest country in Central America. They were visiting Tela, a port located on the Caribbean Sea in the N.W. corner of the country. Since the average wage is \$6 per day, the tax base is too small for the government to provide the services we are accustomed to having.

Dave led a team of volunteers to provide: 1)Construction 2) Health Care 3) Infrastructure 4) Maintenance & Donations

Dave did his presentation using a computer to show slides of all their activities.

The team not only provided labor, they brought in supplies to build new schools, add a classroom to a Day Care Center. They even brought Portable "potties". They aided the Fire Dept., ambulance service, 911 services and police. In the

maintenance area, they provided carpentry, water systems, necessities, and uniforms for the kids. (many kids have only 2 sets of clothes, but they are always clean). They bought school supplies (pens, paper, rulers etc. for families who could not afford these necessities.)

The renovations to the Health Care Center were the roof, bathrooms, shelves, they even cleaned the porch, repaired windows, doors and painted the building with the help of parents and kids.

They brought parts for the ambulance, supplies for the police and the hospital.

Honduras is a soccer country and Dave's son brought soccer balls for the kids. They bought a bike for a teacher to save her a long walk to school every day.

The photos showed the volunteers with their muddy feet, the completed construction and many photos of the smiling kids.

The team of volunteers go each year. Fund raising is year round. He thanked the Rotary Club Partnerships for all their support. They raise 50 - 80 thousand dollars per/year for this project.

They are really making a difference!!!
