Program

Betty introduced the speaker, Peter Goldsmith.

Peter is the owner of Home Care Assistance of Vermont. He previously worked in real estate and opened the Century 21 Franchise in Essex Junction. Then he and a partner built the Healthy Living Natural Foods Market in South Burlington.

The mission of Home Care Assistance Vermont is to provide seniors with reliable, consistent care, enabling them to remain in their own homes and enjoy a better quality of life. The Agency provides assistance with activities of daily living, food preparation, and driving. Many clients have memory problems and need reminders. Most referrals come from sons and daughters who are concerned about their parent's well-being. The agency is based in Burlington but service extends to Waterbury and the Valley. Care may be covered by long term care insurance. The Agency does not provide medical care therefore costs are not covered by Medicare, Medicaid or private health insurance.

Cost of care is \$23:00 per hour with a 4 hour minimum. Round the clock care costs \$260:00 to \$280:00 per day.
