PROGRAM

Our distinguished member, Caryn Crump, who is a marketing consultant and now serves on several boards such as the Medical Center, was the leader of our Rotary GSE team visiting Taiwan for 6 weeks last Spring, is here today to talk about that trip.

She said it was a pleasure to talk about the trip as it was the ultimate experience of her life.

Taiwan Background

Taiwan is located off the east coast of China and was named Formosa or beautiful island by the Portuguese. Both Mandarin and Taiwanese are spoken in Taiwan. Taiwan is the most densely populated country in the world with a population of 23 million living in a land area of 13,900 square miles

Taiwan is a highly technical country and is the 4th largest producer of IT products. In fact, it manufactures 60% of world's notebook computers. The country ranks a respectable 43 in GNP per capita.

GSE Trip Summary:

The GSE team traveled to Taiwan from March 21 to April 17. During their stay they participated in approximately 50 different professional visits, attended 10 Rotary meetings, attended and presented at the District meeting and had numerous cultural visits. They had a private meeting with the Vice President of Taiwan, many city officials, and the Director of the National Library.

One of the highlights of the trip was the delicious food, as the group had 10 to 12 course meals every day during lunch and dinner. Caryn estimated that they tried over 500 different dishes during their 30 day stay.

Taiwan Business Overview

The Country has a total of 1,237,000 small and medium enterprises, which accounts for 98% of all businesses. Most of these are sole proprietorships with 44% having been in existence of over 10 years. This group represents 77% of the total workforce. All team members got to spend extensive time with their vocational peers and visited a great diversity of businesses

Observations

Caryn shared her observations of her vocational days, the clubs similarities and differences and some of the interesting superstitions she noticed during

her trip. She encouraged the Mad River Rotary Club to create the same wonderful opportunity for our Taiwanese visitors in the fall and hopes that club members will encourage others to participate in future GSE programs.
