### PROGRAM

Since Ron Geren missed most of last year while undergoing treatment for cancer, he decided to do another classification speech to help us to get to know him all over again.

Born in Queens, NY during the depression in 1937, his parents named him Ronald Geren- they were too poor to give him a middle name.

Attended PS#94, didn't have TV., cell phones , video games, computers- kids made their own toys. He was the singing cowboy on a TV show every Saturday.

He always had money because he and his friends hustled. They knocked on doors and asked to mow lawns, shovel snow, wash cars etc. He also caddied, set up bowling pins, collected newspapers for  $1^{/\#}$ .

Attended Bayside HS for 2 years, parents moved to L.I. where he attended Hempstead HS, met his future wife, Hilda.

Threw discus, thought he was pretty good until he competed against Al Oerter @ Sewanhaka Meet. Al became the gold medalist in discus throwing in 56,60,64 and 68 Olympics.

Attended Cornell (where he played/practiced football) the team played against Syracuse with Jimmy Brown and lost 55-0.

He graduated in 1959. Was in ROTC. Had wife and child and no job. Army did not want him until 9 months after graduation and General Foods was the only company to offer him a job.

Army - Was a ship-to-shore and beachhead command officer in the Army Marine Corps. Although this was a dangerous job, he was never shot at during his entire stay in the army from 1960 - 1962.

Looked for a job on the West coast, but General Foods made an offer he could not refuse

General Foods- Sales, administration and DM. Moved from NY to Detroit to San Francisco. Then back to White Plains to work on Birds Eye vegetables- met and worked with Chris Kirchen.

While in NY, went to night school at NYU and earned an MBA degree.

1969 Morton Frozen Foods- Div of ITT- kept climbing the ladder

1978 - Started own business - Food Brokerage business in Mid-Atlantic states. HQ in Baltimore. Reached almost \$100 million in sales, employed 49 people and built 25,000 sq.ft. office building.

1997 Watershed Year. Both parents died, Sold everything he owned and simplified his life, but paid huge capital gains tax.

Children - He has been blessed with 3 wonderful children: Jay is a dentist in Alexandria, Va; daughter Pam has her own business designing clothes (she is the one who makes our shirts and hats); son Greg is a photographer in Proctor, Vt.

Ron is now semi-retired; lives in Savannah in the Spring and Fall, at Sugarbush Winter and Summer. His best friend (since childhood) convinced him to move to Savannah and 41 years ago he fell in love with Vermont. (long story)

Rotary - Rena Chernick introduced him to Rotary. Last year was the year from hell for him, but cards, phone calls, e-mails from our club kept him going. Once again he thanked us and is indeed proud to be a part of the Mad River Valley Rotary Club.
