PROGRAM

Deborah Kahn Director, Warren Public Library

I'd like to highlight the joining together of the three Mad River Valley Libraries. [Shows purple banner with new logo] Veronica Wirth of Design Bistro worked with the three librarians to develop our logo and did a wonderful job.

We have an upcoming meeting to begin our Strategic Planning Process for the three libraries on September 12 at 6:30 PM in the lower level of the Warren Town Hall. We are looking for people to join the Strategic Planning working committee. We are hoping for a board member from each participating library and 4 community members from local library supporting towns (Fayston, Moretown, Waitsfield and Warren) to represent as wide a range backgrounds, ages and interests as possible. Please contact one of the librarians if you are interested in serving or if you have someone to nominate as a committee member. The process involves 5 meetings over roughly 2 months.

Warren Public Library has some little known collections. One is a music collection, small and focused on music written in VT, performed in VT or otherwise connected to VT. We also have a very nice collection of music for children which can be borrowed for the pleasure of visiting grandkids!

All of the resources for the library can be accessed from our web-site. On the home page, the catalog links are to the right. Click on the picture of the card catalog to go directly in to do a search, click on "Log in to Your Account" if you want to renew books, reserve items, etc.

For everything else, choose the "Reference Desk" link to the left or above (we have it twice).

At the top of the Reference Desk Page is access to the State Dept. of Libraries catalog which opens the doors of every public library, school library, and many college and university libraries. Once you find the item you want, contact the librarian and the material will arrive in a week or less. This system can also be used to obtain full-text journal articles, including some expensive and difficult to find materials.

Next let's look at Universal Class. This is provided through the Dept. of Libraries to all public libraries in VT at no charge. There are over 500 classes available, all free, all with live teacher, offering continuing education credits and with 6 months to complete the class. The

first time you log in, use your library card number, substituting a 2 instead of a P, then you can create your own password and log-in for future access.

The Vermont Online Library provides access to 100s of millions of newspaper, magazine and journal articles. I've put the most commonly used resources to the right on the access page. I didn't have time to go over everything. You can type in a search term in any of the search boxes, type in your library card number to log-in and you'll go directly to your search results. There are a lot of tools for narrowing down your search. You can access the VOL from the Joslin or Warren web-sites using a library card from either library with no problems.

Finally, Newsbank (America's News) provides access to hundreds of newspapers divided by state. They can all be searched at one time, or you can narrow down to a single newspaper.
