Dinsmore Fulton's Classification Speech

Moved to Moretown in 1992, joining Vermont Natural Resources Council as Director of Development and Membership, after 7 years in NYC financial markets and marketing and 3 years as Director of Capital Giving at Connecticut College (also alma mater). Later became Development Director at Vermont Symphony. Formed Partners in Development, a consulting partnership with offices in Burlington and Warren, serving non-profits and small businesses in the areas of fundraising, grant writing, membership, special events, organizational structure, and strategic planning. Met Leo Cohen in 1996, married in 1998, moved to Charlottesville, VA where Leo held an appointment on the Research Faculty at University of Virginia. DCF joined Planned Parenthood of the Blue Ridge as Development Coordinator for Charlottesville and Lynchburg (imagine how much fun! Jerry Falwell in his heyday!); developed and completed \$1.4 million capital campaign for new clinic building in Cville in addition to regular Annual Fund. Appointed Director of Development for the AIDS/HIV Services Group, retired (to Vermont) 3 years later.

Served on Board of the Hope Fund, Charlottesville, VA which provided cash grants-in-aid to cancer patients for expenses not covered by their insurance, Medicare or Medicaid.

Returned to Vermont full time in summer 2007, where Leo and I live on Tucker Hill Road.

My interests have always been strongly focused on issues relating to the environment, women, and education. ³I believe that membership is so important to a community organization! Just as alumni support is critical to the long-term health of educational institutions, membership in the MRPA reflects community support, and tells us that the community values what the organization is doing. MRPA membership supports the ongoing costs of the Mad River Path maintenance and repair, fees and administrative expenses.
