Ken Amann Classification Speech

Ken was born in 1949, raised in Lynbrook, LI (the town where Gene Scarpato was mayor). He is the youngest of 3 sons. His father was frugal and they lived out of their garden. He taught his

children to live within their means and never borrowed. His parents were also very handy and involved with the community.

His parents bought a home on the day of Pearl Harbor. His neighbors turned out to be a Japanese family and were wonderful people.

He went to Colgate University and earned B.A. in psychology/english. Later he earned a Doctorate in social work at Adelphi University in Garden City.

His work experience involved teaching in the areas of substance abuse, crisis intervention, etc. He developed experimental learning course in Appalachian Poverty and directed a program in West Virginia. He obtained grants to run the Rising Star Program, Franklin School Mentoring project and community policing collaborations in several under-served communities.

He has made many presentations, on teaching programs, substance abuse including a Telecare TV show on Service Learning.

He has publications related to substance abuse, social work and health care and 6 Professional Licenses related to social work.

In 1978 he married Patricia Rosate and they have 2 daughters. The 25 year old went to NYU and studied Global studies and a 27 year old daughter.

He has wanderlust. In 1971 he spent a year on the road and did interesting things, such as picking apples, working as a Santa Claus, hospitals, etc. In 1988, he took a motor trip across the country, living out of his van. In 1990 bought a condo on Rte. 17, went skiing, hiking, played hockey. In 2004 bought current home and in 2008, moved here full time.
