His father and mother were both in politics in New Jersey. Bill is a teacher at Johnson State where all of his students are future teachers.

He taught U.S. history and Vermont history, combining the study of history with democracy. Many of his students have gone into the Vermont legislature. He e-mailed me the following:

Here are the points made at Rotary:

- 1) Supreme court ruling relating to representation in 1960 favored the urban & suburban areas as opposed to the rural areas
- 2) I strongly support the four year term for governor and legislative term could remain at 2 years
- 3) Gave support to Senator Sanders for his strong support for community health centers
- 4) Strongly believe that our citizen legislature is superior to the full time legislators.

When asked about health programs for the state, he said that the state legislatures are waiting for the federal government to enact a National Health bill in order to find out how much financial help they they will receive, as a universal health program will cost a bundle.
