Student's who are proficient readers by 3rd grade are more likely to graduate from high school.

- 16% of children who are not proficient readers by 3rd grade fail to graduate from high school.
- 35% of children who live in high poverty neighborhoods and who are not reading proficiently by 3rd grade fail to graduate from high school.


