IMPORTANT STEPS FOR A COMPLETE MAKEUP
Most fields require a response, which will be printed on your makeup form.

Please be very careful to enter the date missed in the format shown (mm/dd/yy) to include the "P".

There is an email field allowing you to send a copy to your club attendance officer.

The makeup form includes four panels for (less scrolling). Complete each panel and click NEXT. At the end, PRESS SUBMIT and you will see a PDF Makeup document, and one has been sent to the email(e) you provided. You may also PRINT the PDF on your screen.

If this does NOT happen, you have most likely either missed a field or entered the date incorrectly.

If your club is located where there is no Region/District number and or somewhere that is not termed a "state" or "province," please enter a location name that best defines the location of your club.
