SENIOR CONCERNS Off-site Meeting





Patricia Jones introduced Andrea Gallagher, current President of Senior Concerns. Andrea is also a Certified Senior Advisor, Life Transitions Chair, author, and national speaker on senior related topics, such as Boomer Transitions, Live Smart After 50.

Senior Concerns was awarded Non-Profit of the Year last year, by Jacqui Irwin. Andrea began her presentation with a brand-new 12-minute documentary about Senior Concerns. The editing of the film was underwritten by **Patricia** and George **Jones**. Senior Concerns is 44 years-old, and provides daycare programs for seniors as well as support groups for their caregivers. Their programs consist of physical fitness, music memory, pet therapy (including a robotic dog named "Jenny" for those suffering from severe dementia), theme parties for the holidays, children's visits for music programs, TED talks and discussions, senior advocacy for housing, transportation, legal services and Meals on Wheels.

100 volunteers deliver meals and break social isolation for home-bound seniors. Meals are prepared at Los Robles Hospital and delivered by Senior Concerns volunteers. One of the volunteers makes stuffed bears out of clothing from loved ones and gives them to the individuals who have lost a spouse. They then have something of their spouses to love.

The life expectancy has doubled in the last 100 years. 65+ population growth is outpacing all other age segments. California has the largest number of seniors in the country. 1/3 of the population is over 65.


Martin also mentioned a past member that had a lot of medical issues. He said
