

Herb Gooch introduced our speaker, Brad "Brick" Connors, retired Navy Commander. He currently serves as President of Pharos Leadership, a company that helps integrate elite military personnel, with unique experiences and skills, into private companies as they rejoin the civilian world. His book on teaching children what he learned is Fighter Pilot Parent.

His career spanned 27 years non-stop at sea and in the air, mostly from the cockpit of an F/A-18 Hornet fighter bomber — even though he had not touched the sea or flown in a jet until the age of 17. As a Navy Strike Fighter, Brick said, his tours of duty include F/A-18 Hornet Squadron Command, and leadership and instruction to two of the Navy's elite air power training organizations. In a career of 99% pure exhilarating fun, balanced by 1% pure terror, the lessons of leadership, survival, faith, love, perseverance and comradeship were plentiful and direct, and changed his life.

He talked about some of his experiences and those of his Navy comrades. In the hellish prisoner of war camp, a tap code was invented by Mike Christian, and learned by all the prisoners with which to communicate. The practice code was "Faith, Family, Friends and Fun."



Celebration of Those who Give

November was Rotary Foundation Month. Therefore, those active in Foundation giving were celebrated. Foundation Chair **K..T. Connor** explained that Charity Navigator, an independent organization that assesses charities, just declared Rotary Foundation a 4-Star Charity, the highest rating—for the 12th year in a row. Only 1% of charities have ever received 12 consecutive 4-star evaluations. Thus there's reason to value this Foundation , which, delightfully, is the source of many of the grants we receive, as we work locally and with other clubs, even in other countries, to build a better world.

One of the ways we support the Foundation is Polio Plus. Our World Polio Day Pledge drive and the Street Fair fundraising, will reach \$10,000 when the one-time pledges are paid. Others have agreed to support polio eradication monthly or quarterly, which will add more. This news received applause.

Another way we support the Foundation is by continuing contributions in what is known as the Annual Fund. Some give \$10 a month or quarter, some \$100, some even \$250, and some in between. The special thing is that when these contributions and the Polio Plus contributions, come to \$1,000, the Rotarian is honored as being a fellow or friend of the founder of Rotary, Paul Harris.

To celebrate those who have given, Rotary Foundation Committee members Jason Corey, Heather Cousins, and John Bradley presented pins to the following: Christal Doyle for her second Paul Harris, Pat McCoy for his third, Michele Nash for her fourth, Dave Friedl for his Seventh, and Mike Murphy for his ninth. (K.T. noted that he's now on the way to a Major Donor honor when he achieves one more Paul Harris.) Three more generous donors were unable to attend but were honored: Darin Arrasmith for his fourth, Karen Furnari for her fifth, and Chris Kimball for his seventh. All received acclaim at Thursday's meeting!
