

Many Mansions



Carol Freeman introduced our speaker, Rick Schroder, President and Executive Director of Many Mansions. Rick is an attorney, a graduate of University of Wisconsin with his Masters, and UCLA School of Law.



Many Mansions objective is to provide affordable hous-

ing for seniors, low to extremely low-income individuals, and disabled individuals. There are currently 514 units (400 of which are in Thousand Oaks) and 15 affordable housing communities. They currently serve over 1000 people, including over 300 children. 4000 households are on the waiting list. As this is permanent housing, those on the waiting list may wait as long as 10 years.

Otto Stoll pushed to provide support and development programs in the communities. There is Soul House, the first transitional house, Ormand Beach Villas, 40 units in Oxnard, and Ventura County's first affordable housing for veterans. 50% of these veterans have experienced homelessness. There were 130 homeless veterans in Ventura County last year. There is a waiting list for this community. This project is partnered with Oxnard Housing Authority. They also provide case management, mental health programs, as well as employment counseling, Tours begin in January. In addition, there are the Walnut Apartments in Moorpark, a 24 unit low-income housing project.

LA County has >50,000 homeless. To assist with the homeless issue, there are the Silmar Terrace, Boyle Heights, and Lynnwood projects.

Thousand Oaks Rotary Club has been very helpful in helping with programs such as tutoring, summer camp, and scholarships. They are looking for volunteers to get involved in Many Mansions.
