The Search for ET
Dr. Jerry Clifford
Physics/Astronomy Professor

Herb Gooch introduced our speaker Dr. Jerry Clifford, professor of Physics and Astronomy at Cal State Channel Islands. **Herb** said Dr. Clifford sees what we don't see, or what we see but don't notice.

Dr. Clifford has spent much of his career looking for the answer to the question "Is anyone out there?" In regard to extraterrestrials, he said we spend too much money looking for aliens. Gifford spoke of Frank Drake, who started looking for extraterrestrials in 1960. Bank's receiver could detect an equivalent radio telescope at a distance of 12 light years – good enough to listen to transmissions from about 30 star systems, including several stars similar to our sun.

Dr. Clifford said that the Universe is mostly empty space. The distance of one star to another is about as far as from us to Washington D.C. In 1974 a message was sent out to see if a message could come back. Several questions were considered: W hat are factors that determine if we are alone. Must be enough stars. 300 – 400 billion stars in Milky Way galaxy. How many of those stars have planets?

We've never found enough evidence that there's a planet outside of our own solar system. There are over 4000 planets in our solar system. There may be microbial life on moons. What fraction of planets are habitable? We only know that earth is habitable. We got life on earth after earth was formed. 200 - 300 million years ago life existed. The earth is 4.5 billion years old.

12 hours per day Hat Creek Radio Observatory looks for signals of extraterrestrial activity. There has been no ET signal, according to Gifford. Only 1 signal has ever surfaced, but was discarded.

Chris Steele urged all to sign up for the Holiday Program and be sure to indicate guests.



AT THREE YEARS OLD, an age when most toddlers are being assessed on how high they can count or how well they can recite their ABCs, Ramon Resa faced a different standard of measurement: how much cotton he could pile up in the farm fields of central California.

And for many years, as he harvested cotton, walnuts, or oranges, Resa felt that he didn't measure up. That feeling was reinforced by some who might have been his mentors and guides: Even though he graduated at the top of his eighth-grade class, he was told to let a white classmate give the valedictory speech. A school counselor tried to shunt him into wood shop instead of algebra.

But Resa persevered. Today, to visit him at work, you'll walk through a door labeled *Dr. Ramon Resa*. A Rotarian and a pediatrician in Porterville, Calif., he spends his days in an office not far from the tiny box of a house where he grew up among 14 relatives.

AT WORK, RESA MOVES among four exam rooms, sometimes seeing more than 50 patients in a day: a three-year-old suffering from allergies, a two-year-old in for a checkup, a 10-year-old who hurt his thumb playing sports. Resa tickles a child lightly as he checks a throat or belly, switching from English to Spanish as needed. "I can out-stare you," he jokes with a determined boy who has a sinus infection.
