Program: January 21st

Their mission is "Saving Lives by Restoring Hope and Purpose." They deal with the physical and mental disabilities of Veterans through cycling programs that they provide. They design and build custom bicycles for Veterans. There is no cost to participants in the program. They have a budget of approximately \$4 Million with no government funding.

The need is never-ending as the V.A. is overwhelmed. Veterans help Organizations of all types need our support.

In addition to the cycling programs, they provide employment information, help with taking advantage of V.A. Bill benefits and education.

They need both donations and volunteers. They can always use ancillary help with legal, employment and education matters.
