President Tim Weaver introduced David **Stowell** for his Moment of Inspiration. David told the story of Ruby Bridges who was six when she became the first African-American child to integrate a white Southern elementary school in New Orleans on November 14, 1960. Escorted to class by her mother and U.S. marshals

due to violent mobs., Bridges' bravery paved the way for continued Civil Rights action. On her second day, the circumstances were much the same as the first. For a while it looked like Ruby Bridges wouldn't be able to attend class. Only one teacher, Barbara Henry from Boston, agreed to teach Ruby. Ruby was the only student in Henry's class, because parents pulled their children from Ruby's class and sent them to other schools. The other teachers quit. For a full year, Henry and Ruby sat side by side at two desks, working on Ruby's lessons. Henry was loving and supportive of Ruby, helping her not only with her studies but also with the difficult experience of being ostracized. Four years later, Norman Rockwell depicted her brave act of just walking to school, escorted by federal marshals, in a painting, "The Problem We All Live With."
