Who is the Next President of Rotary International?

When John Germ takes office as Rotary International's president in July, it will mark his 40th year in Rotary. In that time, he's likely best-known for leading Rotary's \$200 Million Challenge, a fundraising effort sparked by a challenge grant from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

Rotarians surpassed that goal in 2011, raising \$228.7 million toward polio immunization activities. "I never questioned that we would raise the funds," he says. "Rotarians have been so generous." In fact, raising money for polio was one of Germ's first leadership roles.

He became a member of the Rotary Club of Chattanooga, Tenn., in 1976. "I wasn't involved, other than going to meetings, until 1983 when I was asked to be club secretary," he says. "Then I was asked to participate as district co-chair for the polio fundraising campaign." After that, he was hooked. "The more active I became, and the more good that I saw being done, the more I wanted to do," he says.
