CRAFT talkers were introduced by Vocational Service Chair, **Patricia Jones.**Jonathan Handler was born in NYC and came to California in 1976. in 1985 he entered the computer industry. **Patricia** asked him to tell us about his industry.

Jonathan said in the late 90's his company began developing websites and was so successful that in 2002 they sold the IT portion of his company and just focused on Website design. He said most important thing in website design is SEO-Search Engine Optimiization. "If you dont' focus on that," he noted, "noone will find you on the web."

Niki Richardson- traveled the world with her parents before age of 18, introduced to philanthropy in Mumbai India. Over her career she helped raise 13 million dollars for the arts and other non-profits. **Niki** received an MBA from Pepperdine.

Niki is now the Development Director for TOARTS which was started two years ago when the Alliance for the Arts and the Civic Arts Plaza merged. She talked a lot about the importance of the arts in our society and how it can improve children's lives especially. She said it's just as important as reading, writing and math.
