Introduced by **Jennifer Strong**, club member **Victor Hayek** shared some of the challenges he experienced in his youth. Victor's family immigrated from Beirut, Lebanon to New Jersey when he was age 7.

As a child, he lived in fear, as Lebanon was a war-torn country. Coming to the U.S., he didn't speak any English which made school difficult, but he credits his teachers who took the time to engage and challenge him with who he is today.

Victor's work history is diverse, to say the least. Victor earned his MBA, and taught at the college level for 11 years before embarking on a career in management for a large supermarket chain. He then started his own business, a bagel bakery with retail and wholesale production. After a few years, Victor decided to get involved in public service and became a police officer. Being injured, he left policing and used his business and education experience to become certified as a school business administrator, eventually earning his Doctorate at Seton Hall University. Victor held numerous roles in administration and as Superintendent of several school districts in New Jersey's public education system.

Victor talked about "Sailing Through Life on the Seven Cs:" Choice, Curiosity, Chance, Change, Compassion, Confidence, and Calm. He wrote a book digging deeper into these C's.
