Chris Lamia introduced Richard Linsday. Linsday described Devil Pups as a non-profit organization designed to help boys and girls from all backgrounds gain self-confidence and learn to take responsibility for their actions. The program is not a 'mini boot camp', para-military or recruiting organization for the Marine Corps. Devil Pups is a camp comprising 10 days of challenge, teamwork, discipline and education for boys and girls between the ages of 14 and 17.

It is important to mention that the program is more mental than physical; reflecting the 'whole person' concept, though it does have its demanding physical components. The program foundations are intellectual, spiritual, social and physical. The 10-day program is a combination of outdoor physical exercises, inspirational classroom lectures and demonstrations of Marine Corps operations. No one has ever failed to climb the summit on the 10th day, as the kids help each other, no matter what it takes. On the final day of the camp, they hold a graduation ceremony that friends and family are invited to. They hear stories every year from parents that couldn't believe the positive change they saw in their child when they picked them up at the graduation. All expenses are paid by supporters of the event.


