Greg began by explaining why tech companies are choosing this region for startups. 1980 started the trend with Amgen. Shire pharmaceuticals, Kytheri, and others have also pushed big business here. Xirrus is also in TO, Skyworks, DTS (sound and video enhancements), Blue microphones, Easton (sports technology), Rams (football team), Teledyne, Fender guitars—this is an area of much promise.

CLU has a center for entrepreneurship and hosts Hub 101. There are young children to retirees whom they involve in learning and creating. Everyone is respected and everyone is professional. They also create community events and try to bring everyone together. The goal was putting a 10 week plan together from idea to reality, as well as bringing business to our region. Some events taught skills such as children building lego sets with technology and programming code for sensors, etc. They tell the kids to put the phones away and speak with people real human interaction. There is a strong bond with Oaks Christian School students. In addition to events for children, there are more for adults, such as how to build clientele, what successful entrepreneurs can share with you about their experience, and topics like that.

Greg's approach was energetic and his information both provoking and enriching. He laid out for us the promise of the Conejo thanks to CLU's Hub 101 and the commitment to support the entrepreneur.


