Program: July 18th Wildlife Corridor Beth Pratt, CA Regional Executive Director National Wildlife Federation





In opening her talk, Beth stressed the importance of wildlife conservation. She noted that California was unique in its urban wildlife. Then she spoke of the mountain lion P22, the lone lion in Griffith Park, overlooking the city of Los Angeles. P22, she said, was the "Brad Pitt" of mountain lions. She added that most mountain lions have roaming space of 200 miles or so, but P22 doesn't. In a sense he is trapped because of all the freeways surrounding the park. People accept him as part of the LA landscape; in other states he would have been shot.

Beth shared several maps of open space in the various mountain areas, and freeways that blocked their connection. This creates the problem of "genetic collapse," she stressed. Inbreeding would eventually harm not only the mountain lion generations, but all species of wildlife. This is why, she noted, that wildlife corridors are so important.

She showed several corridors in other countries and then spoke of the plans for the one that will be built over the 101. CalTrans is executing the project, along with the city of Agoura. It will be, she said, the largest corridor in the world once it is completed.
