Program: July 14th State Assembly Update Jacqui Irwin



Steven Stanley introduced Jacqui Irwin our district representative for the State Assembly and former member of our club. Before turning the program over to her, he announced that the club was awarding her the coveted John Conlon Award in recognition of her contributions to the people and spirit of the Conejo Valley. Jacqui warmly opened her presentation by admitting how wonderful it was to be back with the club. She was an active club mem-

ber even after she went from being an employed professional to being elected a city council member.

The work of the State Assembly, Jacqui stressed, is fast-paced and absorbing. There are many committees and many meetings, many of which overlap. She indicated a few priorities that occupied center stage. The engineering program at CSCI was a special favorite, she said. It was important that this area produce strong engineering capability and that the schools strengthen their emphasis on STEM learning. She saw the new engineering degree program a positive sign. Jacqui noted that the emphasis on community colleges was also an important focus of the assembly. There is a great need to redesign remedial programs so that students can be successful in preparing for a career. Grants for this have been increased due to the success of the first round of projects grants have funded. Other program included the UC Office of the President's entrepreneurial emphasis. (results in business incubators employing thousands in startups), the Veterans affairs issues which she has addressed, and more.
