Carol Robinson, Landscape Architect

Tony Guevara, Education Administration



Vocational Service Chair **KT Connor** noted that Vocational Service involved, among other things, getting to know one another's profession in order to appreciate each other and work together to change the world.

KT introduced Carol Robinson first. Carol shared

that she joined her sister one day to go to a talk about landscape architecture. She didn't expect anything from it, but the talk changed her life. She was working for IBM as a systems engineer, and was excited to work every day of her life. When people ask what she does now, people don't always understand. She loves what she does, and says, "when you love what you do, you never 'work' a day in your life." Her largest client has been CLU (since 2004), and the



community colleges. When a major building project happened for these and several other organizations, including Park and Recs, she has done the landscape architecture. She responded to several curious questions.



Tony Guevara then shared his work. He's Head of school at La Reina, not Principal but basically the CEO or superintendent.. He doesn't interact with teachers day to day typically but deal with institutional issues. Why does he do what he does? He was premed for 31/2 years when a friend of his asked him to help coach track at a local high school. He loved it. He changed his path in school to PE. He changed from occupation to vocation, a "calling." He realized that,

every day, he could help change a person's life and that is a big deal to him. A good education is not just in the mind, but also in the heart. An impactful book he read ended with "forget the past 200 pages. It is all about relationships with people." Information, Formation, Transformation is what has formed Tony's sense of vocation. Information is classic learning: books, tests, etc. Formation takes that learning and puts it in with other things like relationships, or using the skills in real life experiences. That is what will be remembered. After that, Transformation will take place. It will change lives. He too responded to questions.
