THE SANTA SUSANA'S FIELD LABORATORY

Lois Curran-Klein introduced John Jones and Stephanie Jennings from the US Department of Energy Environmental Management. They gave us an in depth overview of the cleanup that is ongoing at the Santa Susana Field Laboratory.

The Laboratory was established in 1959 in what was then a remote location. Reactor activity terminated in the 60's, with remediation going on since for 35+ years. Of the original 270 buildings, only 18 remain. All the reactors have been removed (one is in the Smithsonian.)
