Laurel Sykes, Chief Risk Officer, Montecito Bank and Trust



Jennifer Strong introduced Laurel Sykes. Laurel has served as Community Reinvestment Officer for 27 years. She is Director of Risk Management, and Fraud Protection.

Laurel said that Montecito Bank and Trust supports 100 non-profits. \$10,000 given to each of those nonprofits annually 16 million dollars has been donated to-date.

Laurel talked about the importance of cyber security awareness. Common scams are miscellaneous mail scams, lotteries, sweepstakes, phony charities, investment scams, handyman scams, caregiver check fraud, sweetheart scams, check overpayment scams, work at home as mystery shopper scams, as well as virtual kidnapping, Social Security scams, and gift card scams.

Laurel was a wealth of information and encourages all to become more educated in protecting yourselves and others by going to the IC3.gov – the FBI Fraud Division Website, to gain more information. Materials can also be found through Montecito Bank and Trust's Fraud Prevention Materials.



Carol Robinson, MOA recipient, said "Of course we can do that!" which was and is Mike's mantra.

Martin Anderson, former Street Fair Chair, said he remembers when many years ago he was at Dupar's Bar, when a hand reached in and grabbed him, and said we needed to put on a street fair, and that **Martin** was to go to the Ventura Street Fair, see how it's done, and bring back that knowledge so that he could head up the TO Street Fair!
