Jennifer Strong introduced two World War II veterans, Leon Waldman and Barney Leone. One after the other they shared their experiences of serving our country in the military.

Leon spoke of his desire to be a gunner-bomber but ended up getting several levels of mechanic training. He flew over 8 countries occupied by the Germans and 50 missions and described how they served as a team of several planes and dodged the German airfire. He was grateful that so many of them survived. In his squadron only one man did not make it, but only because of a motorcycle accident.

Barney noted that he was in the Navy and he pointed to the model of his Navy ship that he had brought. He had been stationed in Pearl Harbor and was in full combat in Iwo Jima, where the Japanese were in tunnels under the island. He reminded us that the marines he knew that went onto the island to fight them never returned.

Barney said when he returned to Iwo Jima years later, he broke down and cried. Both Barney and Leon kept us in touch with the spirit of Veteran's Day. They reminded us to be thankful for our freedom, for many have died for it, and for our country.




Lois Curran-Klein carried the cup.
