Celebrating Veterans before Veterans Day: World War II Leonard Zerlin







Tony Kourounis introduced our speaker, Leonard Zerlin, WWII veteran. Tony also introduced Leonard's family members who had come to support him. Leonard, 94 yrs., spoke of his service in the US Airforce in WWII. Because of pleurisy as a child he was designated 4F, but talked his way into the service because he is Jewish and wanted retribution against Nazis for killing Jews. He mentioned he had collected many veterans' memories of WWII and put it all together in a book (and had a few for sale). He mentioned not many WWII vets are still living and there are 450 dying per day —"so he had better speak quickly."

Leonard flew in B-25's and moved to B-26's – very dangerous planes. He was a turret gunner. He had three particular harrowing experiences:

1) His plane was supposed to fly a dangerous mission, but the command

limited the squadron to 12 planes (his was to be number 13) none of the planes came back. 2) He let another man seek refuge in his foxhole. The foxhole received a direct hit with a large bomb so Leonard was saved, and 3) he made a difficult and dangerous maneuver to free a bomb that had stuck in the bomb-dropping mechanism of his aircraft and was later awarded the Silver Star medal for it. The membership gave Leonard a lengthy, standing ovation as he finished.
