Teresa Seely introduced Michelle Neff, who shared why she started Spoaring Spirits. She lost her husband iwhen she was n her 30's and realized then how life changes when one loses one's partner. She wanted to know how to deal with it, so she deliberately contacted other widowed people to see what they did to adjust.

She started Soaring Spirits to provide community after loss. Those who join call the community both challenging and rewarding, since positivity and hope are offered to all, both men and women, through it.

Michele noted that her own loss was supported by a loving family, but she needed contact with peers as well, and she found after a while, peers tended to disappear. Her organization provides that peer community to all, rebuilding social structure and confidence.

Michelle noted that there is no "normal" widowed person. Since the average age is 53 it means there are many younger people as well as older people in the group. Finally, she shared several success stories of attendees who were very grateful for the Soaring Spirits resource.






HAPPY \$\$\$\$\$
