Richard Williams introduced Jane Wells, CNBC Business News Reporter and Correspondent. With 30 years in the news, Jane Wells, recipient of the Dupont, and Peabody Awards, has covered such major news events as the Rodney King Trial, Mother Teresa's Funeral, Columbine Massacre, and the Financial Collapse of 2008, just to name a few.

Jane said for people in the media, ads pay their salaries. There is increased competition in the industry, and it has become a niche business. She spoke on the evolution of news broadcasting, and how it must be compelling, and people want to get news from like-minded people. There has been a movement from discussing to shouting.

Jane followed the statistics on viewers, using one story in particular with a start-up from behind bars. "Curtis Carroll discovered the stock market in prison. Through friends and family on the outside, he invests from San Quentin State Prison in Northern California, and he's also an informal financial adviser to fellow inmates and correctional officers. Everyone in prison calls him Wall Street."

Jane showed the story that was originally several minutes long that was broadcast on the Wall Street Nightly Business Report on CNBC. This probably was viewed by 200,000 viewers. Then, the story was condensed to 3 minutes and shown on PBS, which probably was viewed by 500,000. When the story was condensed yet again to about 1 minute and broadcast on Facebook through YouTube, it was seen by 5 million. It showed what the trends are in just where people want to get their news, and the platforms they use.
