**Adam Antoniskis** introduced **Chris Lamia**, who spoke on Bitcoin. Chris followed up on a session he did earlier to help people understand what bitcoin is all about.

Bitcoin is a cryptocurrency. It is a decentralized digital currency without a central bank or single administrator that can be sent from user to user on the peer-to-peer bitcoin network without the need for intermediaries. Bitcoin is now 10 years old. It is a payment and currency system, different from any other government or other type of currency. It is uncensorable. No one can stop someone from sending it anywhere in the world, and after one hour, a transaction cannot be reversed. Dollars in your pocket degrades over time. Bitcoin has never been hacked. It's very secure.

When Bitcoin was released in 2008, it had code that reduced the reward from bitcoin mining by half every four years. This keeps in check the currency's inflation, due to the growing number of miners and ever-faster computers that mine for them. The fees that are charged to users go to the miners.

**Chris** presented another fact-filled program on Bitcoin. He has done his job well but in full-disclosure, wanted everyone to know that he's wasn't presenting this topic to drum-up business, but rather to educate.

# **Thousand Oaks Rotary Meeting** August 22, 2019





Since **Hugo** had everyone ruminating on age, **David Harris** offered respite. He graciously added the advice that we should not worry about old age. It doesn't last very long!












