

Nassau Sunrise Rotary raises \$20,000 for special classroom

APPLYING Rotary's matching grants initiative, the Nassau Sunrise Kotary Club has raised \$20,000 for the installation of a purpose-built classroom designed to facilitate the needs of autistic children. And if it works, the partnership will help fund additional classrooms to foster early testing. "A country that shows empathy for these individuals and works to accommodate their needs, is on the right path," said Education Minister, Jerome Fritzgerald. This is a critically important area that we are paying close attention to. And we welcome the public/private collaboration with Rotary and R.E.A.C.H." The model classroom will be unveiled by Minister Fitzgerald on September 7 at Willard Patton Pre-School on Augusta Street. Karen Pinder, Secretary for the Rotary Clubs of The Bahamas, announced that Rotary Director Dr Janet Brown, from District 7610 in Virginia, who was the lead fund-raiser partnering with Nassau Sunrise, will also be in

attendance. Mike McGinty, designer of the unit, will conduct a tour to showcase the things he has put in place to make it all work. "While these state-of-the-art classrooms are fairly commonplace in the U.S., this will be the first of its kind in the Caribbean," said Felix Stubbs, Past Assistant District Governor for Rotary Clubs in District 7020. Added Mario Smith, President, Nassau Sunrise Rotary Club: "This is a pilot programme. And if it works, we will seek to challenge corporate Bahamas and other civic groups to commit to more of these facilities."
