

The Hon. Charles T. Maynard, Minister of Youth Sports and Culture

Hon. Charles Maynard, Member of Parliament (M.P.) for the Golden Isles Constituency was sworn in as **Minister of State for Culture** by his Excellency the Hon. Arthur Hanna on May 14, 2007, following the May 2 general election.

Charles Maynard was born in Nassau in 1970 to Andrew (Dud) and Isadora Maynard. He graduated from Queen's College and later from the College of The Bahamas in 1988.

He worked with an agro-business development company participating in comprehensive research in the profitability of sustained agricultural and animal husbandry in The Bahamas.

Mr. Maynard's keen interest in the promotion of Bahamian culture led him to develop a Bahamian products and services enterprise. Through still not developed to its full potential, this business has helped pave the way for the creation of a viable Junkanoo industry.

His biggest accomplishment has been in helping to develop the Corner Hotel, a thriving business in the heart of City 2000. The hotel has been one of the benchmarks of Bahamian-owned and operated hospitality properties.

He has played different roles in a number of leading Junkanoo groups and served as the Carmichael Police Consultative Committee for six years.

<u>Last Week's Speaker s Highlights –</u> Ruth Bowe-Darville. President, Bahamas Bar Association

Some of her highlights were as follows:

(i) Mrs. Bowe-Darville said that she will be aggressively focusing on disciplining attorneys moving forward.

She added that the profession suffers "irreparable damage and disrepute from the wrong doings of the few." She

noted that there are many varied complaints. Those complaining about of a lack of communication are perhaps the easiest to remedy. The other complaints about what I term the money offenders represent less than one per cent of our membership and while I readily admit that that is too much, without making excuses for them or defending them. I must emphasize that that is not the entire Bar."

- (ii) Mrs. Bowe explained that the Bar through its ethics Committee and Disciplinary arm is serious about policing its members. She said that the Legal Profession Act (LPA) needs further amendment as does its regulations. I have challenges to correct the behavior of errant lawyers and to instill in others that must abide by the Professional Code of Conduct. I must improve the disciplinary process so that complaints can be disposed of more quickly."
- (iii) She also noted that the public does not appreciate the statutory process involved in disciplining attorneys. "The complaint is made to Ethics Committees, which is not the Bar Council," the bar president said.
- (iv) The council does not deal with the complaint. The process is a quasi-judicial process and both sides have to be heard. The complaint must be in writing and supported with all documentation. The two Disciplinary Tribunals are voluntary and sit on matters on a regular basis."
- (v) Mrs. Darville further explained that in order for the disciplinary process to be more effective, the Legal Profession Act must be amended. She said amendments to that Act will also increase the number of persons on the Ethics Committee and the number of Tribunals that exist.
- (vi) There are currently 977 active lawyers on the roll. Of that number, 112 lawyers are employed by the government, 33 are employed in the banking sector and 832 are in private practice.
