
Let us dream big, imagine new possibilities, have the courage to change the world, and create one new hope at a time!

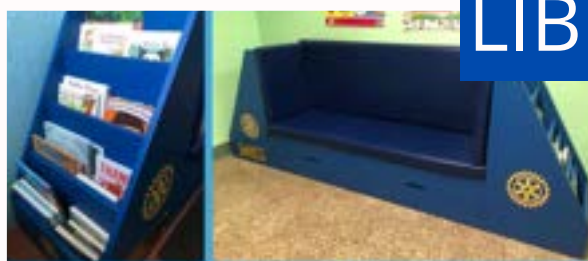

In early August 2023, a series of wildfires broke out in the U.S. state of Hawaii, predominantly on the island of Maui. The wind-driven fires prompted evacuations, caused widespread damage, killing at least 115 people and leaving 388 others missing in the town of Lāhainā.

Through generous personal donations from our membership, the Rotary Club of Grand Cayman Sunrise donated approximately USD \$1,000 to assist with relief efforts managed by Rotary District 5000.

Such successes would not have been possible without the amazing prize donations, our helpful organizers from Sunrise and Rotaract, the amazing members who ran the show, our host - Craft F&B, and to those in attendance who actively participated.

We were able to collectively raise approximately KYD \$1,400, 25% of which will be given to the Rotaract Club of Grand Cayman for their club's contribution to the Rotary Foundation, the balance will go towards our club's contribution to the Polio Plus Fund.



## About Guaruma

The Guaruma Project began in the year 2000 in Honduras an American photojournalist partnered with a Honduran environmentalist to set up a program for vulnerable youth in isolated and impoverished communities to help engender a passion for photography plus provide a channel of escape from recruitment into a life of crime and violence by the pervasive drug cartel.

Over the years, with the support of volunteers and charitable organizations, the project has expanded into a structured educational (after-school) program that now offers courses in Photography, Computer Basics, Environmental Awareness and Ecotourism, and serves 80-100 youth from ages 12-21 who reside in villages in the mountains along the Cangrejil River.

Rotary Sunrise has been involved with the Guaruma

project since 2008, offering varying levels of support financially as well as physically, with our first mission trip taking place in 2009 and running consistently until being halted by the COVID pandemic in 2020. We were also instrumental in the construction of the Guaruma Medical Clinic which officially opened in May 2020 and is being run by two young doctors who grew up in the community. The Medical Clinic serves the communities in the mountains and delivers subsidized care for the children of the Guaruma project.

Our support continues. This Rotary year the Guaruma Education program will receive US\$2000.00 quarterly – 1500 from Rotary Sunrise + 500 from Rotary Central; while the Medical Clinic will receive US 500.00 from Rotary Sunrise. These funds will purchase educational materials and medical supplies.

Multiple Paul Harris Fellow recognition is extended at subsequent \$1,000 levels (e.g., \$2,000, \$3,000). Recognition consists of a pin with additional stones corresponding to the Recipient's recognition amount level:

- 2,000 to 2,999.99 - one sapphire
- 3,000 to 3,999.99 - two sapphires
- 4,000 to 4,999.99 - three sapphires
- 5,000 to 5,999.99 - four sapphires
- 6,000 to 6,999.99 - five sapphires
- 7,000 to 7,999.99 - one ruby
- 8,000 to 8,999.99 - two rubies
- 9,000 to 9,999.99 - three rubies

The Paul Harris Society (PHS) is a district-administered recognition for those who elect to personally contribute US\$1,000 or more each year to the Annual Programs Fund, PolioPlus, PolioPlus Partners or the Humanitarian Grants program.

World Polio Day is commemorated on the **24th October** every year. And over the last couple of years our Rotary District 7020 has championed this cause and led activities that promote the eradication of Polio.
