Rotary Foundation Month of Activities continues with Buy-A-Kid-A-Book and our Annual Flea Market!





SCRABBLE SCRUM 2023

The Rotary Sunrise Scrabble Scrum has become a fun, competitive annual event for both high-schoolers and adults alike. The competition started in Grand Cayman almost a decade ago as a corporate literacy fundraiser and then progressed a year later to Grand Cayman's high schools as an inter-school competition to increase literacy awareness.



The Scrabble Scrum involves teams of 4-6 players placing words on the board in a fast 10-minute timed round. Teams are given a starting word and other compulsory or bonus words to place during the round. The race is on to use every letter to avoid penalty points, and the winning team is the one that has scored the most points after three rounds.

The annual Corporate Scrabble Scum fundraiser took place in October 2023 with seven teams from five companies battling for the top spot. The triumphant Champions were PwC's team Scrabble Eggs scoring over 3,100 points. Very close in second were PwC's Scrabvengers, and Ogier's Oracles placed a close third. Rotary Sunrise is especially grateful to KPMG for hosting this event at its rooftop terrace.

Rotary Sunrise is extending the reach of this educational literacy game to primary school classrooms by donating around 200 Scrabble game boards together with the Scrabble Scrum game rules, suggested lesson plans and scoring-app guidelines to government and private primary schools in the Cayman Islands.

SUNRISER PROMOTES NEW PARENTING CARDS

Social worker Rhonda Morrison, who has led multiple parenting education sessions, has teamed up with her colleagues Kai Matthews-Mowatt and Rotarian Keisha Smith to collaborate on the creation of parenting cards to understanding and improve behaviors or children. These cards are scheduled to be launched in the first quarter of 2024. The cards, which will be titled 'You, Me, Us', are designed to assist parents and their children to engage in candid and meaningful conversations regarding subjects that they might not normally talk about.

In an online article published by the Jamaican Gleaner, Rotarian Keisha explained that she firmly believed "parents are the cause of a lot of the behaviour issues that children face, which then is a ripple effect into what we see in society today". According to Rotarian Keisha, parents generally belief that introducing held the certain conversation topics to their children at an early age may overexpose them, placing them in situations where they could be abused or subjected to other negative things. She remarked that this practice needs to be addressed and that it was time to abandon the



mentality of "sweeping things under the carpet". The questions on the cards are directed to both the parent and child and are to be used in a "simple, game-like way", Smith said, noting that it would encourage engagement.

She added that it will encourage family time between parents and their children which is a critical period in a child's life, "if it's even half an hour ... [as] it helps to build rapport. "The hope is that it will not only help to build relationships, but those children will then pass on the knowledge to friends – because you know children talk – 'that this is what I discussed with my mother' and overall positive things that they can share and the mindset of these children ... will start to change," she explained.
