Millions of drops make a difference for Ukraine refugees

Like most of the world, my wife and I were concerned when we heard of the buildup of Russian military on the Ukraine border. As a Rotary Director, I had been to Ukraine six years ago for a club charter and have Rotary friends in Ukraine. Knowing that my friends were in danger was awful. The day the invasion happened was very hard for us. And seeing the pictures of what was happening brought tears to our eyes. We asked, "who could do this to small children?"

I started communication with my Rotary friends in the Lviv International Rotary Club on a daily basis, and I learned there were two Danish members of the club, which made it even easier to communicate. They kept me informed what they were doing, and one day, one of them, Lars, called to tell me they had this young man from Ukraine staying in Germany who needed a place to stay. He asked me if my club could find a place for him somewhere.

Prior to that, my wife and I had been talking about what we could do to help, even feeling a bit helpless. When we got the call from Lars, we said yes, without a doubt, we would make a home for him. Hosting Artem has given us something very tangible to do.

We went and picked him up in Germany. Before that, we had gone to a store in town and let them know we had this young man coming and that we didn't know how many clothes he was bringing with him. The shop owner was very gracious and let Artem pick out two of everything: two trousers, two briefs, etc., and we didn't have to pay anything.

For us, it has been an eye-opening experience. When you are sitting back in your own environment, you have one way of thinking about things. But then something like this happens, and it changes your perspective on the world.

We've had a lot of discussions with Artem. Along the way we have learned a lot from him, about our cultural differences, the history of his country, and the background on Soviet-Ukraine relations, which we didn't know a lot about before.

I am also realizing that all my years in Rotary and as a senior leader have prepared me to be more equipped to help and want to help in this situation. Rotary teaches us we need to be flexible and accommodating of different cultures, and we need to do what we can for people who do not have the same opportunities as ourselves. I'm not sure I would have had that same view if it had not been for Rotary.

We are doing our small part. It's just a drop in the ocean. But millions of drops make a difference.

The response we have seen in Denmark, and all over Europe really, has been tremendous. We all understand Ukrainians need a place of peace. No one would want to be pushed out of their country. When I see what Rotarians are doing worldwide to support Ukraine, it makes me proud to be a Rotarian.

President-elect Jennifer Jones is poised to lead Rotary into a vibrant, diverse future

President-elect Jennifer Jones' office at Rotary International world headquarters in Evanston, Illinois, feels different from those of her predecessors, but that's in no way a result of the fact that on 1 July she will become Rotary's first female president. On the wall hangs a recent gift from a friend — a black scratch-off map on which Jones can record every Rotary destination she visits during the next two years. When we speak it's September, two months since she took office as president-elect, and on the map, only Chicago has been revealed — many planned events were canceled or postponed due to a rise in COVID-19 cases. Today, Jones is the only person on the 18th floor of One Rotary Center. There are no phones ringing, no fingers tap-tap-tapping on keyboards in the cubicles outside her door. One could do cartwheels through the Rotary boardroom and nobody would notice.

Jones elbow-bumps her visitors, Rotary magazine senior staff writer Diana Schoberg and senior editor Geoffrey Johnson. Then, spaced apart at a table in her office, they discuss her vision for the year ahead. "If you start to think about how exponentially Rotary can touch the world, we're more than a club," Jones says. "We're a movement."

Jones is president and CEO of Media Street Productions Inc. in Windsor, Ontario, where she is a member of the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland. (Her husband, Nick Krayacich, is past president of the Rotary Club of La Salle Centennial and was recently selected as governor-nominee-designate of District 6400.) Her company's specialties include radio and television production, corporate and nonprofit videos, and live show productions.

Using her media background to elevate Rotary's global profile is one of the primary goals of her presidency, and Jones is planning what she calls the "Imagine Impact Tour" to showcase to the world several large-scale, sustainable projects in each of Rotary's areas of focus. "I see this as a way of increasing our membership," she says. "When we tell our stories, like-minded people will want to join with us."

A Rotary member since 1996, Jones played a lead role in the organization's rebranding effort by serving as chair of the Strengthening Rotary Advisory Group. She is co-chair of the End Polio Now Countdown to History Campaign Committee, which aims to raise \$150 million for polio eradication efforts. She also led the successful #RotaryResponds virtual telethon in 2020, which raised critical funds for pandemic relief and attracted more than 65,000 views.

The programme aims to build respectful young adults to live a meaningful life despite the many hardships they face within their communities. Peace Fellowships

Each year, Rotary awards up to 130 fully funded fellowships for dedicated leaders from around the world to study at one of our peace centers.

Through academic training, practice, and global networking opportunities, the Rotary Peace Centers program develops the capacity of peace and development professionals to become effective catalysts for peace. The fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and internship and field-study expenses.

Since the program began in 2002, the Rotary Peace Centers have trained more than 1,500 fellows who now work in over 115 countries. Many serve as leaders in governments, NGOs, education and research institutions, peacekeeping and law enforcement agencies, and international organizations like the United Nations and the World Bank.

Our fellowships

The Rotary Peace Fellowship is designed for leaders with work experience in peace and development. Our fellows are committed to community and international service and the pursuit of peace. Each year, The Rotary Foundation awards up to 50 fellowships for master's degrees and 80 for certificate studies at premier universities.

Choose the program that's right for you

Master's degree programs

Accepted candidates study peace and development issues with research-informed teaching and a diverse student body. The programs last 15 to 24 months and include a two- to three-month field study, which participants design themselves.

Professional development certificate program

During the one-year blended learning program, experienced peace and development professionals with diverse backgrounds gain practical skills to promote peace within their communities and across the globe. Fellows complete field studies, and they also design and carry out a social change initiative. This program is intended for working professionals. Fellows earn a post-graduate diploma upon completion of the program.

Rotary Facts

At our 1933 convention, #Rotary founder Paul Harris told attendees, "Rotary is thrown open to representatives of all walks of life, to representatives of all countries and all forms of religion...Herein lies the genius and the glory of Rotary."

Today is **Paul Harris' birthday**. In 1938, when he turned 75, Harris received birthday telegrams from the Rotary network around the world, a testament to the value placed on friendship and goodwill in the early days of Rotary.




