
MEMBERSHIP RULES

RI President Holger Knaack's March Message

As someone who knows firsthand the great leadership potential of Rotaractors, I always look forward to World Rotaract Week, which we are celebrating from 8 to 14 March. Rotaractors are the focus of all three of my presidential conferences this year, and I was proud when, two years ago, the Council on Legislation voted to elevate Rotaract by including Rotaract clubs as members of Rotary International. Before that, the Council had already made dual membership possible, and shortly after, the Board of Directors decided to do away with Rotaract's age limits.

But we are only just embarking on our journey together. Partnering effectively doesn't happen by itself. It requires both sides to be open and to understand the value of cross-generational alliances. Louie De Real, a dual member of Rotaract and Rotary, explains.

Joint virtual meetings have helped Rotaractors introduce Rotarians to new ideas and tools, pioneering unique ways for clubs to collaborate. In the case of pandemic and disaster response, Rotaract clubs used social media to coordinate efforts, drive information, and fundraise, while Rotary clubs used their networks and resources to amplify support, provide logistics, and bring the goods and services to communities.

Rotaractors' innovative virtual engagement and professional development activities inspired Rotarians to support and follow suit. The pandemic made Rotaract clubs realize that we can immediately connect and partner with Rotary clubs through virtual platforms. With constant collaboration, we realize that Rotary and Rotaract indeed complement each other that we are part of a single organization with shared goals. Both sides add value. Rotarians can be mentors and service partners to Rotaractors, while Rotaractors can demonstrate to Rotarians that difficult jobs can be simplified and limitations can be surpassed through digital approaches. This synergy motivates Rotaractors to become future Rotarians: I joined Rotary because Rotarians gave me memorable membership experiences through inspirational moments of collaboration. I needed to be a Rotarian to inspire Rotaractors the same way, now and in the future.

That same synergy leads Rotarians to realize that while Rotaractors may have a different culture, we all share a common vision of uniting people to take action. Rotaract's unique ways of doing things serve as inspiration for innovation, helping Rotary increase its ability to adapt to future challenges. Rotarians and Rotaractors will build the future together, so let's start

I see no difference between a Rotary club and a Rotaract club, except perhaps for the average age! Many Rotarians still view Rotaract as our youth organization, but I see it differently. For me, they are part of us, and they are like us. To be successful together, we need to have mutual respect — to see each other as equals. Let's see Rotaractors for who they really are: students and young leaders, but also successful managers and entrepreneurs who are capable of planning, organizing, and managing a Rotary institute — including breakout sessions in five languages — as they did in Berlin in 2014.

As we take this journey together, let's remember the strengths of Rotary and Rotaract. And, as Louie says, let's get started right away in building the future together. In doing so, we open endless opportunities for our organization.

Celebrate Rotaract by giving

World Rotaract Week is an annual celebration of the success and significance of Rotaract in communities around the world. This year, from 8-14 March, Rotaractors, worldwide are celebrating the wonderful experiences that inspire them to put service above self.

I vividly remember that sunny Saturday afternoon in 2014 when our president at the Rotaract Club of Federal University of Technology, Owerri, Nigeria, led us to a Rotary Foundation seminar organized by leaders in our zone. I was overwhelmed to discover how donations to The Rotary Foundation, no matter how small, are transformed into life-changing projects in areas where they are greatly needed.

Giving Certificate

During the 2018-19 year, I served on the Rotary International Rotaract Committee. I took part in brainstorming an annual Rotaract recognition opportunity that would match the enthusiasm of Rotaractors to support The Foundation. In April 2019, The Rotary International Board of Directors and Foundation Trustees approved the Rotaract Giving Certificate which recognizes Rotaract clubs that have five or more members who make a combined donation of at least \$50 during the Rotary year. In the first year, 146 clubs earned a certificate, and together, they contributed \$42,400 to the Annual Fund supporting the

work of Rotary members around the world.

Bringing it home.

Africa earned 69 of the certificates. Together with district Rotaract representatives across Africa, we developed fundraising tutorials in English and French and assisted 10 districts in implementing strategies for achieving their giving goals. Here are some campaigns from our region that may help you obtain your giving goals:

- Encourage members to take part in a Monthly Giving Plan.
- Encourage your club to seek to be a 100% Donor Club, which recognizes clubs where all members contribute to the Foundation. Create a banner to celebrate their achieve-
- Take part in a larger fundraising effort. Our region supports the World Greatest Meal (WGMeal), which raises money for polio through meals.
- Organize a fundraising activity. District 9212 created the Rotaract Mt. Kenya Hike.
- Encourage members to donate on the Friday of World Rotaract Week and Giving Tuesday the first Tuesday after Thanksgiving.
- Motivate members to give by explaining the Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) recognition


ROTARIAN CODE OF CONDUCT

The following Code of Conduct has been adopted for use by Rotarians all over the World. This is based on "The Four-Way Test".


