Rotary Questions and Answers Meeting

In today's meeting members were given written questions on various aspects of Rotary, and asked to give their own responses.

These are a summary of the questions and responses:

Q: Why do we need to apologise for not attending meetings? PDG Pishu: It is good manners, common etiquette. Failure to do this means we are RINO (Rotarians in name only).

Q: Why join Rotary? Rtn. Phyllis: For the camaraderie, there is strength in numbers so pooling our resources and numbers enable us to achieve more.

Q: What is the project that you have most enjoyed? PP Robin: The water and sanitation project during PP Judith's year when we raised funds donated and installed water tanks to one of the Mustard Seeds Group Homes.

Q: Why Rotary and not another service organization? PP Duncan: We are simply the best; the level of commitment required puts us in that category.

Q: Why is it important/interesting to visit other clubs? Visiting Rotarian Donald Ridgley: On a visit to Honduras I saw the meaning of compassion. The son of one of the members, a Supreme Court judge, had just been shot. He was at the meeting with a heart of forgiveness. That experience taught me the meaning of compassion and the value of what we can do in the area of peace and reconciliation.

Q: Where do you see this Club in 50 years? Rtn. Joliker: My daughter is an enthusiastic Interactor. This leads me to believe that the future of Rotary in this area is good if we can continue to win the new generation.

Q: How do we encourage members to participate? Rtn. Darrell: By having engaging guest speakers, placing greater emphasis on projects that we do, and having more member participation in meetings. (Continued below)

Q: What do you like most about being a Rotarian?

PP Conrad: The opportunity to be of service, to make an impact and to look back and see how the lives of those who have been helped have changed for the better.

Q: What project would you do now if you had the choice.

PP Denton: I would start a project in High Schools to enable young people to develop

entreprenurial skills. Small business make a positive impact on our ecomony so it is important to encourgae their development.

Avenues of Service

Club Service focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the smooth functioning of Rotary clubs.

Vocational Service involves club members serving others through their professions and aspiring to high ethical standards. Rotarians, as business leaders, share skills and expertise through their vocations, and they inspire others in the process.

Community Service Community Service is the opportunity Rotary clubs have to implement club projects and activities that improve life in the local community.

International Service encompasses efforts to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the world and to promote world understanding and peace. It includes everything from contributing to PolioPlus to helping Rotary Youth Exchange students adjust to their host countries.

New Generations Service recognises the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities such as RYLA, Rotaract, Interact and Earlyact club service projects, and creating international understanding with Rotary Youth Exchange.
