- He has previously worked for a hardware and photographic company as a technician and manager for 12 years until its closure in 1983, shortly before his acceptance into The Salvation Army training college in Kingston.
- He has always had a desire to help people and is particularly interested in the care and well-being of the elderly.
- The Salvation Army gives him the scope to fulfil the desire and passion he has to be of service.
- He stated that The Salvation Army is an organization that seeks to care for the whole person, recognizing the tri-part nature of man. He said it is a caring organization with the heart to God and the hand of man; saving souls, growing saints and serving suffering humanity, irrespective of class, colour or creed.

- They can also volunteer and give funds to support the work of the organization.



Avenues of Service

Club Service focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the smooth functioning of Rotary clubs.

Vocational Service involves club members serving others through their professions and aspiring to high ethical standards. Rotarians, as business leaders, share skills and expertise through their vocations, and they inspire others in the process.

Community Service Community Service is the opportunity Rotary clubs have to implement club projects and activities that improve life in the local community.

International Service encompasses efforts to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the world and to promote world understanding and peace. It includes everything from contributing to PolioPlus to helping Rotary Youth Exchange students adjust to their host countries.

New Generations Service recognises the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities such as RYLA, Rotaract, Interact and Earlyact club service projects, and creating international understanding with Rotary Youth Exchange.
