THE IMPORTANCE OF TIMELY DUES

When dues go unpaid, our club's financial stability is at risk, impacting our ability to fund projects, organize events, and contribute to Rotary International's initiatives. This means our status as a chartered Rotary Club becomes at risk. We all share in this responsibility to hold up our end. Ensuring that dues are paid on time means that we can keep building, connecting, and making a difference together.



TIPS FOR HURRICANE SEASON: STAY SAFE. BE PREPARED

- Check thoroughly the roof of your house, hurricane shutters, hooks and latches and repair where necessary.
- Make sure you have emergency equipment in your home. These include water boots, raincoats, flashlights, batteries, portable radio, kerosene lamps and matches.
- Trim trees that hang over your house and other buildings for those that touch power lines call the Jamaica public service
- Be ready to evacuate if you live in low-lying or flood- prone areas. Decide early on evacuations route Avoid flooded water-ways i.e. fords, gullies, streams or rivers, either on foot or in vehicles.
- Ensure that all important documents are secured in plastic bags or waterproof containers.
- Turn off all electrical power, gas and water supplies in areas that are in immediate danger from flooding.
- Avoid areas with damaged roadways.
- Avoid where necessary areas prone to landslide & flooding.
- In case of extensive rainfall avoid going on the road except where absolutely necessary.
- Make sure your emergency kit is stocked and includes non-perishable food, cash, charging devices, a flashlight and batteries in case of power outages.
- Check in with friends, family and neighbors to see if older adults and people with disabilities need assistance.
- Don't forget the needs of your pets. Shelters do not take household pets, so remember to create a plan and have supplies available for your animals.
- Have a designated safe house or location to quickly evacuate if necessary.

CHECK ON THESE EMERGENCY ITEMS: WATER, RAINCOATS, WATER BOOTS, FLASHLIGHTS AND BATTERIES, BATTERY-POWERED RADIO, HURRICANE LAMP, MATCHES, HURRICANE SHUTTERS, HOOKS AND LATCHES. KEEP A WRITTEN LIST OF IMPORTANT NUMBERS AND ADDRESSES IN CASE OF BATTERY FAILURE IN POWER OUTAGES.

EARTHQUAKE SAFETY TIPS

HOW TO SAVE YOURSELF DURING AN EARTHQUAKE 3 1 2 DROP cover HOLD ON DOWN ONTO YOUR HEAD AND NECK TO YOUR SHELTER YOUR HAND AND KNEES H --+ --÷ * INSIDE CALM DOWN OUTSIDE TRY TO STAY STAY WAY FROM FURNITURE, STAY AWAY FROM BUILDING, WALLS AS CALM AS POSSIBLE WINDOWS AND LAMPS AND POWER POLES STOP IF YOU USE A WHEELCHAIR, IF YOU ARE IN A CROWDED IF YOU ARE DRIVING PUT THE BRAKES ON PLACE PROTECT YOUR HEAD STOP IN A SAFE PLACE, IN A SAFE PLACE AND PROTECT WHITE YOUR ARMS OR TAKE TURN ON THE HAZARD LIGHT YOUR HEAD WHITE COVER UNDER SEATS AND TABLES AND STAY INSIDE THE VEHICLE YOUR ARMS
