Welcome to the third issue of the 2024-25 Rotary Club of Montego Bay Newsletter! Did you know that more than 775 million people over the age of 15 are illiterate? That's 17% of the world's adult population.

So, what can we do about it?

Rotary Clubs around the world are taking action—empowering educators, offering teacher training, promoting adult literacy, and providing scholarships. Our Club has played its part over the years by providing scholarships to children who face immense challenges.

But what more can we do?

The problem is vast, and it's easy to feel overwhelmed. Yet, even small steps can make a big difference. This month, we're taking another step by launching the 'Rotary Club of Montego Bay Literacy Distribution Program,' a new initiative that expands our efforts to address basic education and literacy. This official President's project aims to empower children ages 3 through 12 to read, write, and create. Since its inception, we've secured over J\$500,000 for distribution efforts and gained the endorsement of the Ministry of Education as a partner in this initiative.

Small strides lead to bigger conversations and more significant impact. By engaging community partners in the process, we move closer to bridging the literacy gap.

On that note, I encourage everyone to get involved. Read to a child, offer to help a parent and reach out to schools to see where the need is greatest.



Tips for Hurricane Season: Stay Safe. Be Prepared

- Check thoroughly the roof of your house, hurricane shutters, hooks and latches and repair where necessary.
- Make sure you have emergency equipment in your home. These include water boots, raincoats, flashlights, batteries, portable radio, kerosene lamps and matches.
- Trim trees that hang over your house and other buildings for those that touch power lines call the Jamaica public service
- Be ready to evacuate if you live in low-lying or flood- prone areas. Decide early on evacuations route Avoid flooded water-ways i.e. fords, gullies, streams or rivers, either on foot or in vehicles.
- Ensure that all important documents are secured in plastic bags or waterproof containers.
- Turn off all electrical power, gas and water supplies in areas that are in immediate danger from flooding.
- Avoid areas with damaged roadways.
- Avoid where necessary areas prone to landslide & flooding.
- In case of extensive rainfall avoid going on the road except where absolutely necessary.
- Make sure your emergency kit is stocked and includes non-perishable food, cash, charging devices, a flashlight and batteries in case of power outages.
- Check in with friends, family and neighbors to see if older adults and people with disabilities need assistance.
- Don't forget the needs of your pets. Shelters do not take household pets, so remember to create a plan and have supplies available for your animals.
- Have a designated safe house or location to quickly evacuate if necessary.

CHECK ON THESE EMERGENCY ITEMS: WATER, RAINCOATS, WATER BOOTS, FLASHLIGHTS AND BATTERIES, BATTERY-POWERED RADIO, HURRICANE LAMP, MATCHES, HURRICANE SHUTTERS, HOOKS AND LATCHES. KEEP A WRITTEN LIST OF IMPORTANT NUMBERS AND ADDRESSES IN CASE OF BATTERY FAILURE IN POWER OUTAGES.
