Our two exchange students from Mexico, **Sofia Marales** and **Jesus Esteban** and two of last year's RYLA students, **Aaron Haung**, and **Benton Renaud** also helped fill the boxes.

#### The Avenue of Flags



In March 2018, a joint meeting was held of all of the service clubs in Ankeny. Those in attendance were able to learn about some of the projects each club was participating in. Representatives form each of these clubs have continued to meet and have selected a project that all clubs can work on together. It is **Avenue of Flags.** This is currently a project of the Optimist Club. For \$35 they set a flag at dawn in your yard and remove it at dusk on these five holidays: **Memorial Day, Flag Day,** 

**Independence Day, Labor Day, and Veterans Day.** The flag is  $3' \times 5'$  and is flown from a 10' pole. They are placed in a permanent grommet set in your yard. The grommet is set low and will not interfere with moving or other activity. The poles and flags are property of the Optimist Club and are stored and maintained by the club. The project has been approved by the City of Ankeny. All proceeds will go to help support Ankeny's youth and families.

#### **Grant for AMP Funded**



Nick Lenox, Parks & Rec Director for the City of Ankeny was in attendance at the noon meeting on October 23rd to accept a check in the amount of \$4,784 to be used to purchase additional benches at the Ankeny Market Pavilion. These funds are being provided by a Rotary District 6000 Community Improvement grant in the amount of \$2,392 which was then matched by the Rotary Club of Ankeny.

#### **Donation Completed to Ankeny Library**



Five representatives from the **Ankeny Library** were in attendance at the noon meeting of the Rotary Club of Ankeny to accept a check in the amount of **\$5,220**. This check represents the proceeds form a **District 6000 Community Service Grant** in the amount of \$2,610 and a match from the Club. These funds will be used to purchase a virtual reality

processor, a laptop cart, with five laptop computers for use in classrooms for children as part of the Hatch Program. The Hatch Program is a library program for students to utilize the library for various education uses such as CAD drawings for redesigning buildings, bridges, digital sewing machines, creation of videos using a green screen, and other uses. Also, the equipment will allow after school hours use for students who are unable to access a computer or a network at home. #### **Rotary Foundation Minute**



Rotary is Here are a few projects that have been funded by Rotary's global grants in the USA:

- 1. Dental Equipment and oral healthcare services were provided to low-income residents in Ventura, City California.
- 2. In Pittsburgh, PA, and Richmond, California, Rotary provided free longitudinal care for 75 patients at two Rotacare Free medical clinics.
- 3. It provided a baseball clinic with a focus on teamwork and anti-bullying among youngsters ages 7-16 in Yonkers, New York.
- 4. It developed and implemented a school based dental model within two schools in Cabell County, West Virginia.
- 5. And it created a "Kids Club Literary Project" to promote age/grade level reading for children living in Loveland Housing Authority apartments in Loveland, Colorado.

These projects had a budget of over \$30,000 and were initiated by clubs and districts within the United States with financial support from countries outside the US. Your contribution to The Rotary Foundation enabled this to happen. Thank you.
