We are "So Proud" Coach Rhoads is our Speaker

Our speaker this week will be ISU's head football coach Paul Rhoads. In his first year as ISU's Head Coach, Rhoads became the first Cyclone football coach to win seven games in his first season since 1907 and the first coach in ISU history to post a wining record in his initial Cyclone season since 1931. Highlights of his first season included a 9-7 win at Nebraska and a 14-13 victory over Minnesota in the Insight Rowl.



Rhoads is a native of Ankeny where he was the valedictirian of his class at Ankeny High School. From there he went on to earn a bachelor's degree in economics in 1989 at Missouri Western and was the recipient of the Chris Faros Scholarship, which honors the football team's top senior studentathlete. Rhoads added a master's degree from Utah State in 1991.

His coaching experience includes graduate asistant positions at Utah State and Ohio State and assistant coaching positions at Pacific and at Iowa State for Dan McCarney. He was then the defensive coordinator at Pittsburg and Auburn prior to becoming the head coach at ISU in 2009.

Rotary International was the the world's first service club. On February 23, 1905, the first Rotary club of Chicago was formed by Paul P. Harris, an attorney who wished to capture, in a professional culb, the same friendly spirit he had felt in the small towns of his youth. The Rotary name derived from the early practice of rotating meetings among members' offices. By 1921, Rotary clubs had been formed on six continents and the organization adopted the Rotary internation name a year later.
