RI Policy on Politacal Requests

Please visit our Club Website Sponsors. To place your ad click here. At this time of year many service clubs receive requests from political candidates to make presentations at their meetings. The following is a message from our District Governor, Gary Welch on RI position on this subject.

I have recently been asked by several clubs how to handle political requests. Since I am in politics I understand the need to get your name before the public to be elected. Rotary International has taken a position of being accepting of all religions and being non political. Below are quotes from the Rotary International Manual of Procedure and the RI Constitution pertaining to political activity. As you are faced with multiple requests for "face time", I would request that you follow the RI Policy and share it with your membership. *At no point may they ask for political contributions at a Rotary Club meeting.* Many clubs have decided to offer the candidate the opportunity to present their information after the election. Not surprisingly, most have declined.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY.

Page 24 "RI and its member clubs must refrain from issuing partisan political statements. Rotarians are prohibited from adopting statements with a view to exerting any corporate pressure on governments or political authorities. However, it

is the duty of Rotarians:

- 1. In their clubs, to keep under review political developments in their own communities and throughout the world insofar as they affect service to their vocations and communities as well as the pursuit of the Rotary objective of world understanding and peace. They are expected to seek reliable information through balanced programs and discussions so that members can reach their own conclusions after a fair, collective examination of the issues.
- 2. Outside their clubs, to be active as individuals in as many legally constituted groups and organizations as possible to promote, not only in words but through exemplary dedications, the awareness of the dignity of all people and the respect of the consequent human rights of the individual."

Page 154 - "Rotarians may not use the name and emblem, Rotary club membership lists or other lists of Rotarians for the purpose of furthering political campaigns. Any use of the fellowship of Rotary as a means of gaining political advantage is not within the spirit of Rotary."

Page 260 in the RI Constitutional Documents Article 13 Section 2 No endorsements -

"This club shall not endorse or recommend any candidate for public office and shall not discuss at any club meeting the merits or demerits of any such candidate. "Section 3 Non-Political a. "Resolutions and Opinions. This club shall neither adopt nor circulate resolutions or opinions, and shall not take action dealing with world affairs or international policies of a political nature." b. Appeals. This club shall not direct appeals to club, peoples, or governments, or circulate letters, speeches, proposed plans for the solution of specific international problems of a political nature."

Most clubs have adopted the RI Constitutional as their own Club Constitution which has the above Articles. If you have any questions let me know.
